## The President's Column

Over the years I have entered events in shotgun, smallbore and action pistol. Presently I am involved in action pistol where I have seen real growth and lots of new shooters. At a recent event 20% of the shooters had never participated in a competitive match. WOW. Shooters don't have to travel too far to find matches every weekend as I found out when I went to matches 5 weeks in a row.

There are several factors that seem to be getting new shooters involved action pistol. A desire to properly develop shooting skills, with equipment that is practical for everyday use at a reasonable cost.

Most of the shooting sports seem to be an equipment race that can cost many thousands of dollars. That is simply not appealing to new shooters who are looking for getting into a sport with good equipment for substantially less than those thousands of dollars. Another factor seems to be the seemingly complicated rules that all sports seem to generate. Keep it simple stupid is just not practiced when it comes to rulemaking and a rulemaking bureaucracy seems to develop and then becomes overdeveloped.

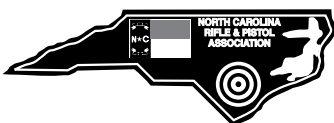
Pistols, holsters, and magazine carriers suitable for daily use and action pistol are available at a reasonable cost. Handgun ammo is cheaper than rifle and shotgun ammo and pistols have a more direct appeal with the interest in concealed carry. So the appropriate equipment is reasonable and the interest is there, then there seems to be a desire to make up rules that stifle the interest of the new shooter.

In trying to examine rulemaking versus the new shooter and many seasoned shooters who see too many rules I have asked myself why and who? Why are there so many rules and in the process who seems to be making them up. The who seems to be the top dogs in the sport that drive the desire for more rules, more clarification, more divisions in each of the shooting sports. These people have difficulty in looking back to when they started because it was so long ago and they have forgotten how they felt when they began their entry into the sport.

We need to find a way to simplify some of the shooting events so we can capitalize on the interest that is out there among the public who want to become more proficient with a firearm. The action pistol sports are still of interest to many who want to develop their shooting skills and I am afraid we are heading in the wrong direction with all of the rulemaking. Yes we need to pay very close attention to safety and a really good job has been done there by all of the groups that are governing bodies of the various sports. Let's get back to basics and look at the KISS principle. Maybe some of the new shooters need to get together with those who want to simplify a sport and either start a new type event and or get some of the rulebooks changed so that we can get more folks involved in the shooting sports.

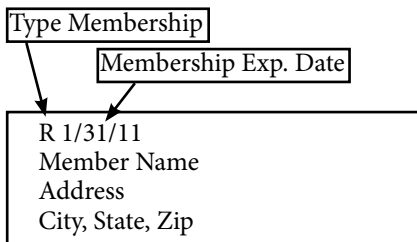

# Despite The Lies, Armed Citizens Save Lives

Gun-ban advocates like to talk about how armed citizens aren't a deterrent to crime. They boast that "a good guy with a gun stopping a bad guy with a gun" is just some kind of figment of gun owners' imaginations.

In fact, Demanding Moms head Shannon Watts has gone so far as to say, "This has never happened. Data shows it doesn't happen." More recently, on Jan. 12, The New York Times editorial board, pontificating against laws that would better enable law-abiding Americans to defend themselves with firearms, wrote: "The grim truth is that concealed-carry permit holders are rarely involved in stopping crime."

Ironically, on the very same day an Arizona armed citizen used his gun to save a state trooper's life—once again proving that Watts, the Times and other gun-banners who say good guys with guns don't stop bad guys with guns are intentionally lying for political reasons.

Here's the story.

According to a report from KTAR News, the trooper was investigating an early morning rollover accident when someone shot him in the shoulder. The attacker then jumped on the trooper and began ruthlessly beating him.

An armed citizen was passing by with his family when he noticed the attack underway. Stopping his car, he ran toward the scene and asked the officer if he needed assistance. The officer answered, "Yes."

The armed citizen ran back to his car, grabbed his gun, approached the scene and ordered the attacker to stop. When the bad guy continued to beat the trooper, the armed citizen shot the assailant several times, killing him.

Watts and other gun haters will likely just ignore this incident. They'll claim that it never happened, or that the officer wasn't in danger. Or they'll say the armed citizen didn't play an important role in the episode.

If they won't take my word for it, though, perhaps they'll listen to the director of Arizona's Department of Public Safety. Col. Frank Milstead pulled no punches in stating, "I don't know that my trooper would be alive without [the armed citizen's] assistance." He added, "I would just say thank you."

It's a good thing that this armed citizen, who chose to remain anonymous, didn't listen to the lies from anti-gunners. If he had—and if he had believed what they continually repeat—he might have decided to leave his gun at home that day.

The result would have been yet another law enforcement officer never getting to return home to his waiting family.

# Open Carry Law in North Carolina

***Disclaimer: This article is merely a survey of laws affecting the open carry of firearms in North Carolina, and may be incomplete. It has been published for general interest only and is not a legal opinion. Please consult with a NC criminal attorney to learn how NC firearms and criminal laws may relate to your particular situation.***

Open carry (the practice of openly carrying a firearm on one's person in public) in North Carolina was not created by any particular state law or statute. Rather, open carry results from the people's right to keep and bear arms provided by both our state's constitution and the federal Constitution.

As most already know, the Second Amendment of the United States Constitution, adopted on December 15, 1791, reads "A well regulated Militia being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed."

Article I, Section 30 of our state Constitution, modeled on the Second Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, begins: "A well regulated militia being necessary to the security of a free State, the right of the people to keep and bear arms shall not be infringed..."

The right of the people to keep and bear arms stated in both the federal and NC constitutions descends from an even older tradition. The right to keep and bear arms has long been supported in English common law, and was influenced by the English Bill of Rights of 1689. The eighteenth century

English jurist Sir William Blackstone described the right to keep and bear arms as an auxiliary right, which supports the natural rights of self-defense, resistance to oppression, and the civic duty to act together in defense of the state.

## LIMITATIONS

Anyone seeking to legally open carry must understand that three bodies of law may apply: federal, state, and local.

### Federal Limitations

A thorough discussion of federal firearms law and open carry is beyond the scope of this article. When on federal property, such as when at a federal courthouse or at a post office, beware that federal law may apply instead of NC state law.

With respect to federal courthouses and U.S. Postal Service offices, open carry is prohibited at both locations.

### NC State Law Limitations

Open carry is prohibited in the following places or situations, or by the following persons, under NC state law:

Schools or at curricular or extracurricular activities sponsored by a school (Class I Felony) N.C. Gen Stat § 14-269.2

Assemblies and establishments. Open carry is prohibited in any assembly where a fee has been charged for admission, or in any establishment where alcoholic beverages are both

sold and consumed (note that the owner or organization sponsoring an event, however, may permit open carry by participants in the event) N.C. Gen Stat. § 14-269.3

State buildings such as the State Capitol Building, Executive Mansion, Western Residence of the Governor, or on the grounds of these buildings, including any building used to house any court of the General Court of Justice. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-269.3

Events occurring in public places. It is unlawful for any person participating in, affiliated with, or present as a spectator at any parade, funeral procession, picket line, or demonstration upon any public place, owned or under the control of the State of North Carolina, or any of its political subdivisions, to possess or have immediate access to any dangerous weapon. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-277.2

Going armed to the terror of the people. It is a common law infraction to arm oneself with a weapon, including a firearm, for the purpose of terrifying others, and go about on public highways in a manner to cause terror to others.

State Fairgrounds. Open carry by members of the public who are not law enforcement officers is prohibited on the State Fairgrounds during the NC State Fair.

On private property where prohibited by notice. NC law allows a private business or property owner to

post a notice prohibiting a concealed handgun. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-415.11. Even though this statute technically only mentions concealed handguns, it is likely that NC courts would extend that prohibition to openly carried weapons also.

Minors. In general, a minor under age 18 may not carry a handgun in a public place. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-269.7

Persons acquitted of a crime by reason of insanity. It is a Class H felony for a person who has been acquitted of a crime in NC by reason of insanity, or who has been found to lack the capacity to proceed in the prosecution of such crimes, to possess or have control of a firearm at any time. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 15A-1002 and N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-415.3

Convicted felons. People who have been convicted of felonies are prohibited from possessing firearms. This does not apply to people whose felony has been pardoned, or to people who have had their firearms rights judicially restored. N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 14-415.1, 14-415.4

### Municipal and Local Restrictions

North Carolina state law allows for certain municipal and state limitations on firearms carry, with case law in this area not fully developed. Anyone who wants to carry openly in North Carolina must understand and follow local laws, ordinances, regulations, and restrictions.

### USE OF THE HANDGUN

As a legal matter, the gun owner should keep the gun holstered, particularly in a public place, except in emergency circumstances. NC law creates penalties for inappropriate firearm use:

It is a Class A1 misdemeanor to point any gun or pistol at any person, whether loaded or unloaded, either in

fun or otherwise. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-34

Use of the firearm inappropriately could additionally draw a felony charge. Assault in North Carolina does not require actual harm, and can mean only pointing a firearm inappropriately at another person. Any person who assaults another person with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill may be punished as a Class E felon. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-32(c)

### Stand Your Ground Law

North Carolina's "Stand Your Ground" law defines justifiable use of a firearm in emergency situations:

[A] person is justified in the use of deadly force and does not have a duty to retreat in any place he or she has the lawful right to be if either of the following applies:

a) He or she reasonably believes that such force is necessary to prevent imminent death or great bodily harm to himself or another.

b) Under the circumstances permitted under this N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-51.2, if he or she is in his or her home, workplace, or car and is in fear for his, hers, or another's life.

N.C. Gen. Stat. § 14-51.2 and § 14-51.3.

Exceptions to the use of deadly force as allowed above

include use in self-defense against law enforcement officers and bondsmen acting in their official capacities.

The second part of the law is referred to as the "Castle Doctrine" referring to the notion that one's home is one's castle, and one should be able to defend the home against intruders.

Regardless of the Stand Your Ground law, if the firearm is discharged in an altercation, law enforcement and the legal system may later scrutinize every second of the event. When the use of deadly force is later reviewed, it will be very important for the gun owner to have exercised clear judgement, and to have minimized harm to any innocent bystanders.

# Why I Should Renew My NCRPA Membership?

About ten years ago the NCRPA had a membership approximately twice the size it is now. The main reason for the decrease in size is the smaller interest in conventional competitive NRA competitions. When I first began shooting bullseye pistol at Camp Perry all four pistol ranges with three relays were almost full. Maybe a thousand shooters filled the huts pistol week. Now the attendance pistol week is 400 or so. High power and smallbore have suffered similar attendance losses. Younger people are shooting 3-gun or various action pistol competitions and old eyes and knees on the shooters over fifty five have sent them fishing.

The NCRPA is the official State Association of the NRA. Our primary function has been to carry out the competitive activities of the NRA. We also have had education programs, scholarships, state championships, and other NRA programs. We have also always conducted a strong junior high power program. During certain periods we have done legislative activities.

In recent years our main activity has been in the North Carolina Legislature. For the last seventeen years or more we have had a representative full time in the halls of NC law makers. For the last twelve years we have had a full time hired professional lobbyist representing our interests also. Both of our representatives are registered with the Secretary of State of North Carolina. We are the only lobby on gun issues from the State of North Carolina registered with the Secretary of State. Our efforts are coordinated with NRA-ILA. But the NRA lobbyist is assigned to four other states and cannot focus all of his time here in North Carolina. If you ask your legislator who in North Carolina is the Gun Lobby he will surely respond” NCRPA”.

At this time the NC Legislature is mostly or primarily pro-gun. This has not always been the case and it probably will not be the case in the future. Right now our job is not up against a brick wall. That may change. When it does change the success of our efforts will come from numbers of membership. We need to build strength now before our foes declare universal background checks are only common sense and Michael Bloomberg pours millions of dollars into NC ad campaigns. It worked for him in Nevada where their State Association was down in numbers. It almost worked in the state of Main.

Why should I renew my membership? To promote junior shooting, scholarships, NRA competitive shooting, State Shooting Sports, other NRA programs. But also to preserve your Second Amendment Rights here in North Carolina. The strength of the State Association comes from strong membership... one renewal at a time. When you mention to your friends that you renewed your NCRPA membership be sure to tell them why and encourage them to sign up for membership in the NCRPA. We need help from every gun owner, hunter, target shooter, and concealed carry individual in the state.

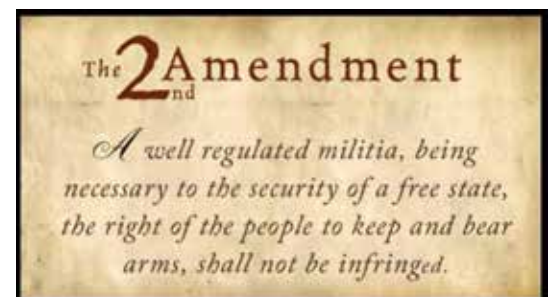
