## The President's Column

### Vote in this year's important election

We need to get out and VOTE on November 3rd! At no time in the past history of the United States has the votes of the pro-freedom population been more important. There are assaults on our Constitution and the Bill of Rights that could easily wipe out our right to own and bear arms, our right to defend ourselves, our family, and our homes. We need to vote for pro-Second Amendment candidates to preserve our liberties.

Liberal governors and mayors have encouraged and condoned anarchy in our major cities by the socialist anarchists of ANTIFA (which had Communist origins in Germany in 1919 to overthrow the Kaiser and establish communism as a form of government), Black Lives Matter (BLM encouraged and financed by Socialist George Soros), and the militant anarchist group, NFAC (who marched on and intimidated tourists at Stone Mountain, Georgia, and in Philadelphia where three of their members were wounded by a negligent firearms discharge by one of their highly trained members). Many of our cities and states are no longer safe.

On August 13th Joe Biden announced that his running mate for the Democrat presidential ticket would be U. S. Senator, Kamala Harris (D-California), a staunch opponent of the Second Amendment who has a long record of embracing virulently anti-gun policies. A recent Rasmussen survey revealed that many voters believe 76-year-old Biden is in the early stages of dementia. Many of these Democrat voters attach more importance to Biden's running mate because they feel he will not be able to fulfill his term if elected. According to an August 13th article in the Washington Examiner,

Biden picked Harris because of her "fanaticism toward gun control." To that point Harris said during a debate, "If by my 100th day in office Congress fails to put a bill on my desk, I'm prepared to take executive action. Anyone who sells more than five guns a year will be required to perform background checks. I'm prepared to direct the ATF to remove the licenses of gun dealers who fail to follow the law. 90% of guns associated with crime have been sold by 5% of the gun dealers. We need to take their licenses away."

There are many new firearms owners who have joined our ranks because of fear of anarchy and the subjugation of gun-rights by North Carolina sheriffs, all under the guise of the effects of the current COVID-19 pandemic and violent protests of ANTIFA, BLM, and NFAC. I hope that new firearms owners will seek firearms safety and marksmanship training from certified instructors and not rely on the lack of skills as demonstrated by the couple in Missouri. It is the firearms owner's responsibility to learn and understand the requirements that must be present in our state to use lethal force. (Threat of death or great bodily harm and the facts and circumstances would lead a person of "ordinary firmness" to believe the same).

In conclusion, I hope that all the NCRPA members and their families will get out and vote. Vote for your Constitutional rights by supporting pro-Second Amendment candidates. Encourage your neighbors to vote for Conservative pro-Second Amendment candidates.

## **General Assembly fails to override Gov. Roy Cooper's veto of bill that would have allowed all citizens to worship safely**

When Gov. Roy Cooper (D-NC) vetoed HB 652, the Second Amendment Protection Act, he stated, "This bill allows guns on school property, which threatens the safety of students and teachers." Members of the North Carolina Rifle & Pistol Association (NCRPA) worked hard in support of this bill and are deeply disappointed that he ignored a bipartisan effort that would have made North Carolina citizens safer while attending religious services.

NCRPA president, Fred Edgecomb, was incredulous, "Did the governor actually read the bill, and is he unwilling to acknowledge that mass shootings at places of worship in recent years were stopped by armed parishioners?"

North Carolina law allows firearms in religious institutions unless the church prohibits them. HB 652 would only have applied to churches that operate nonpublic schools on the same property, or in the same building, and explicitly stated that guns may not be present during school hours, or when curricular, extracurricular, or school sponsored activities are occurring. "This bill will allow a person with a concealed handgun permit to possess and carry a handgun on church property that also has a nonpublic school on the same property. Members of the faith community want to be able to protect themselves and their families. Why can't we have equal protection under the law? I guess Governor Cooper is playing politics during an election year," stated Edgecomb at the time of Cooper's veto.

Dennis Allen, NCRPA's chief lobbyist, also stated, "This shows the difference in perceptions that Governor Cooper seems to hold with those of the faith community and with those of us who believe in constitutional governance and private property rights. If a property owner can prohibit firearms on their property based on the right to control their property, should not other property owners enjoy the right to allow them? It appears that the Governor is more concerned with retaining government control over as many aspects of citizen's lives as possible than he is with the safety of those same citizens. It is clear that this veto, if not overridden, ensures that churches will remain undefended targets of violence."

HB 652 originally passed with bipartisan support, however the vote to override failed because six legislators changed their vote. They included Representatives, Chaz Beasley (D – District 92, Mecklenburg), Jean Farmer-Butterfield (D – District 24, Wilson. Resigned 7/16/20), Joe John (D – District 40, Wake), Marvin Lucas (D – District 42, Cumberland), Garland Pierce (D- District 48, Hoke & Scotland), and Brian Turner (D – District 116, Buncombe).

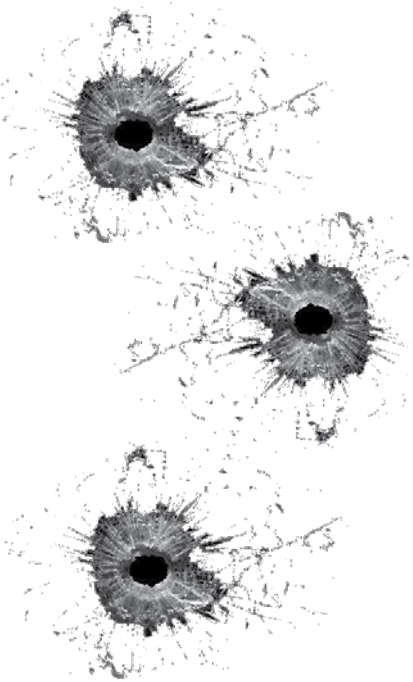

# Opinion: I'm voting for President Trump for the second time

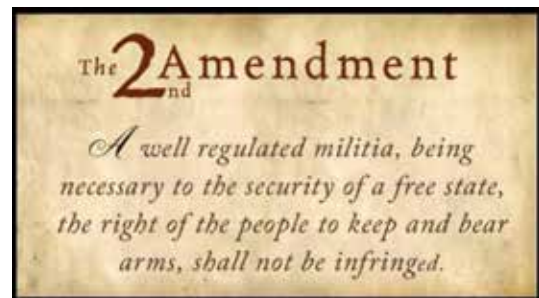

# NRA GUN SAFETY RULES

I'm sure everyone already knows and obeys the rules, but a bit of a refresher never hurts.

The fundamental NRA rules for safe gun handling are:

## **ALWAYS**

**Keep The Gun Pointed In A Safe Direction**

This is the primary rule of gun safety. Common sense dictates the safest direction, depending on different circumstances.

## **ALWAYS**

**Keep Your Finger Off The Trigger Until Ready To Shoot**

When holding a gun, rest your finger alongside the frame and outside the trigger guard. Until you are actually ready to fire, do not touch the trigger.

## **ALWAYS**

**Keep The Gun Unloaded Until Ready To Use**

If you do not know how to open the action or inspect the chamber(s), leave the gun alone and get help from someone who does.
